Foreword

The financial and organisational details of CIFOR's 2002 Annual Report are presented this year as an Annexe to CIFOR's tenth anniversary publication *Forests and People: Research that Makes a Difference*.

Forests and People: Research that Makes a Difference provides an overview of CIFOR's first decade of operation, including the reporting year of 2002. It contains a brief historical account of why CIFOR came into being, and describes some of the research programmes, conducted by CIFOR and its collaborators, which have helped to provide a better understanding of forest issues, especially in the tropics. *Forests and People* explores research that has had a real impact on the way in which forests are used and managed, and on the thinking of the people who determine what happens to our forests.
